For this school year she is enrolled in the 7:45 AM Lego club, 7:45 AM Karate class and Ms. Kirschnick's Art Studio at 3:45 pm – all of which she is highly interested in. These are all extra curriculum activities. When she was in 1st grade she took Hip-Hop Dance Class and A Taste of Dance – (Ballet, Tap, Jazz, and Tumbling) and also a Sunday swim class.
