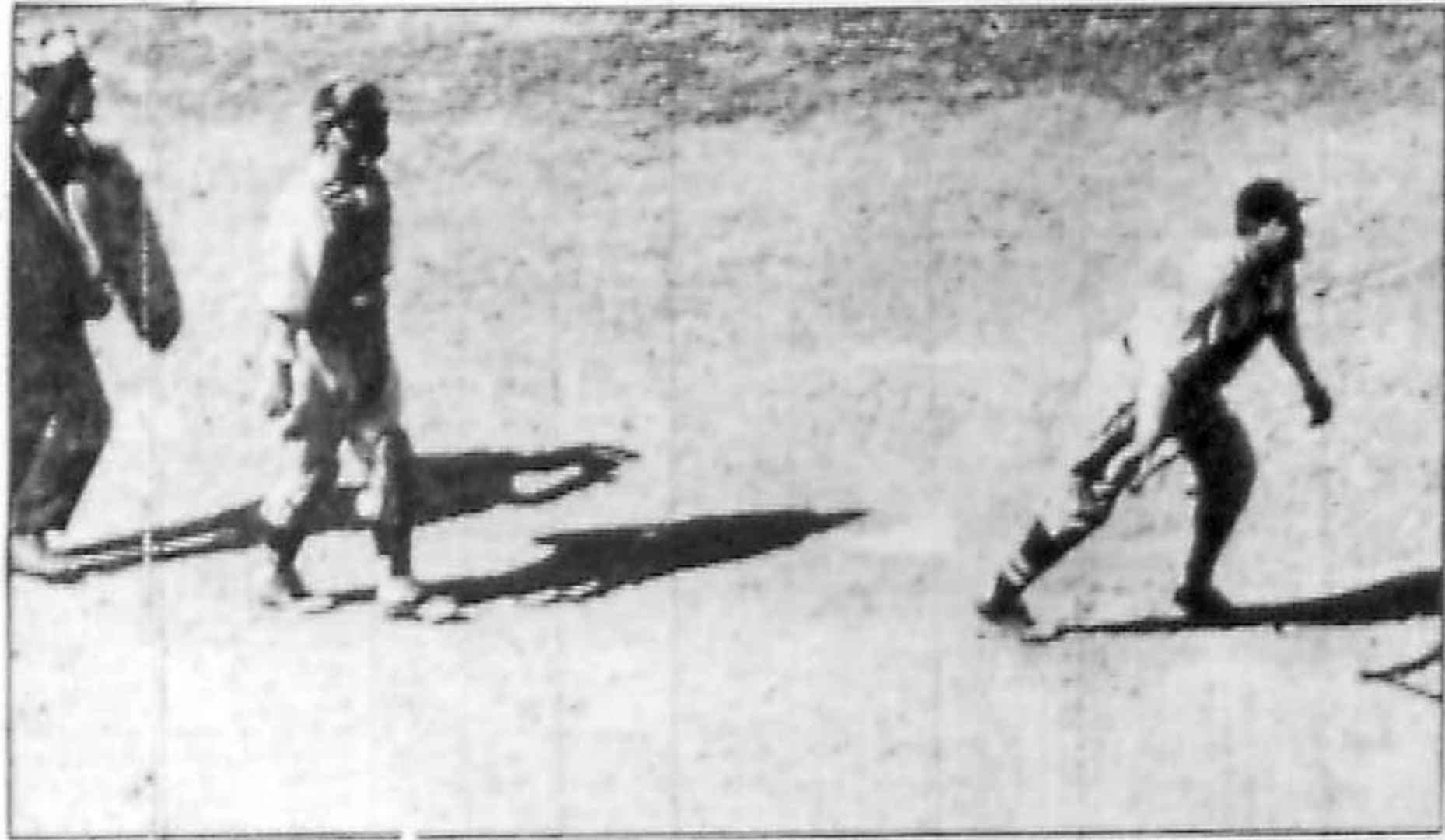

### Little Wins Second British Golf Title

Beats Dr. Tweddell 1 Up in 36-Hole Final—Becomes First American to Win Two in Row When He Successfully Defends Championship

LONDON, May 25—Lawson Little, husky Californian, wrote a new chapter in golfing history today when he became the first American to win the British amateur second time. He had a narrow escape, however, being carried to the final green by his opponent Dr. Tweddell.

Little, San Francisco origin, who held the national championship on both sides of the Atlantic, defeated today's great but unpopular Dr. Tweddell, who was the holder in 1932.
